#### Explanation of project or need that this money will be used for \_\_\_

We will primarily use the funding this year to reinforce the operating budget for The Center. April through August is a meager time of year annually. Although there was adequate funding to cover our operating cost for one fiscal year, we also have social programs; The <u>Family Interventions program</u>, the <u>Assist To Stand and Stand Together</u> program, the <u>Transportation Assistance</u> program, the <u>Bridge</u> program- a food pantry to address food insecurity in our community, and 1-1 peer interactions daily to maintain connections in recovery from all substances and mental health issues.

We are especially aware of the sweeping plague of opioid overdose and illegal use in our community. We have specific programs that address the use of injectable substances, the spread of Hepatitis and HIV, the homelessness, lack of parenting, adverse health effects, and daily living skills lost to these addictions and diseases. In order to address all these issues through peer interaction, recovery group meetings, daily support reinforcement and strengthening supports, we need to be here, in the building, in the community, in the trenches-daily! The lights on and doors open represent hope and healing to a vast number of our fellow community members. We are requesting a small portion of our operating costs be covered to help us continue to build and enhance the awesome work we do. The money we are seeking is intended to do just that, keep the doors open and the lights on - so to speak. The actual average for the next four months (from this time last year) is \$3,861.41/mo. April through July total \$15,445.65. I believe it is appropriate to ask for the amount that we have typically run short of this time of year. I am also including a request for \$5000 that can be used to insure and fuel the pickup truck we have been donated the use of for our Thursday and Friday transportation needs. This will include advertising a ride

share arrangement, offering some fuel assistance, and scheduling sober group recovery trips to outside meetings and events as well as maintaining the vehicle.

The operating costs described in this document are: Wages, Accounting, Building Maintenance, Taxes, all Utilities (including internet and phones), Insurances on Board and Employees and Training Volunteers in Center operations education. This is the foundation we need to be able to accomplish the variety of services we offer as well as developing new and incorporating tested and true methods of support!

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As described above, through engagement, support, empowerment and inclusion. The groundwork being done by and
more importantly, through The Center is the long-term countermeasure needed to combat the very source of addiction and
illness. The isolation and stigma are the markers of the debilitating and invasive aillment we battle daily. Our campaigns of
mental health first aid, addiction awareness, harm reduction and creating connection are the very medicine we as peers and
fellows can offer our community.

The actual average for the next four months from this time last year is \$3,861.41/mo. April through July total \$15,445.65. I believe it is appropriate to ask for the amount that we have typically run short of this time of year. I am also including a request for \$5000 that can be used to insure and fuel the pickup truck we have been donated the use of for our Thursday and Friday transportation needs. This will include advertising the ride share on those two days as well as maintaining the vehicle.

The <u>yearly</u> average is shown above at \$8007.34/mo. for the entirety of the year of 2022. If I were requesting an average monthly operating cost from the yearly amount, the sum would be \$32,029.36 not including the 5K for the Transportation program.

The operating costs described in this document are: Wages, Accounting, Building Maintenance, Taxes, all Utilities (including internet and phones), Insurances on Board and Employees and Training Volunteers in Center operations education.

The wages for staff of 3 to 5 persons paid minimally, (\$9-\$15/hr.) averages at 5760.42 for those four months.

I am requesting \$20,500 for the Gem County Recovery Community Center to help us continue operations until regular funding sources deposit. The Center will continue to offer the support, referrals, trainings, and custom services explained in our meetings. I am committed to finding and securing other sources of funding as well so as not to exhaust the County's availability to assist multiple areas of Opioid use impact.
