AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LEWISTON AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 4858, THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2022 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2023, APPROPRIATING ADDITIONAL MONIES THAT ARE TO BE RECEIVED BY THE CITY OF LEWISTON, IDAHO IN THE SUM OF TWENTY-FIVE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED TWENTY-ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED TEN DOLLARS (\$25,521,810); AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

# BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEWISTON, IDAHO:

SECTION 1: Ordinance No. 4858, the Annual Appropriation Ordinance of the City of Lewiston, Idaho for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2022 and ending September 30, 2023, is hereby amended as follows:

The additional sum of Twenty-Five Million Five Hundred Twenty-One Thousand Eight Hundred Ten Dollars (\$25,521,810) shall be appropriated out of the following revenues:

To whom it may concern,

Officer wellness has always been a priority for me and I have found a capable and robust resource along with a practical funding source. Cordico wellness resources resolves the challenges facing LPD regarding a wellness program, providing personnel in a stressful occupation and their family members with on-demand access to confidential, relevant and effective wellness resources. The Cordico wellness app offers a complete range of self-assessments as well as continuously updated videos, guides and articles on more than 60 behavioral health topics. We can also incorporate agency-specific content as well as one-touch access to peer support, therapists, and chaplains.

Personnel can get help on common issues such as trouble sleeping, dealing with tough incidents, alcohol/drug dependency assessment, financial wellness and benefit from a wide range of resources to support work/life balance and career longevity. The contract is renewable yearly and can easily be cancelled if the application does not work well for the department. The contract has been reviewed by the city attorney's office.

To ensure compliance with the Opioid settlement disbursement justifications, I spoke with Stephanie Guyon at the Idaho Attorney General's Consumer Affairs Office. She advised it would be an appropriate use of the funds to purchase an officer wellness program (please reference the attached email).
