

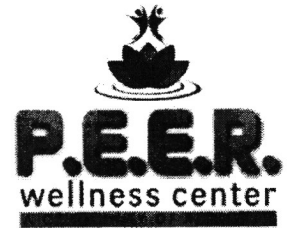

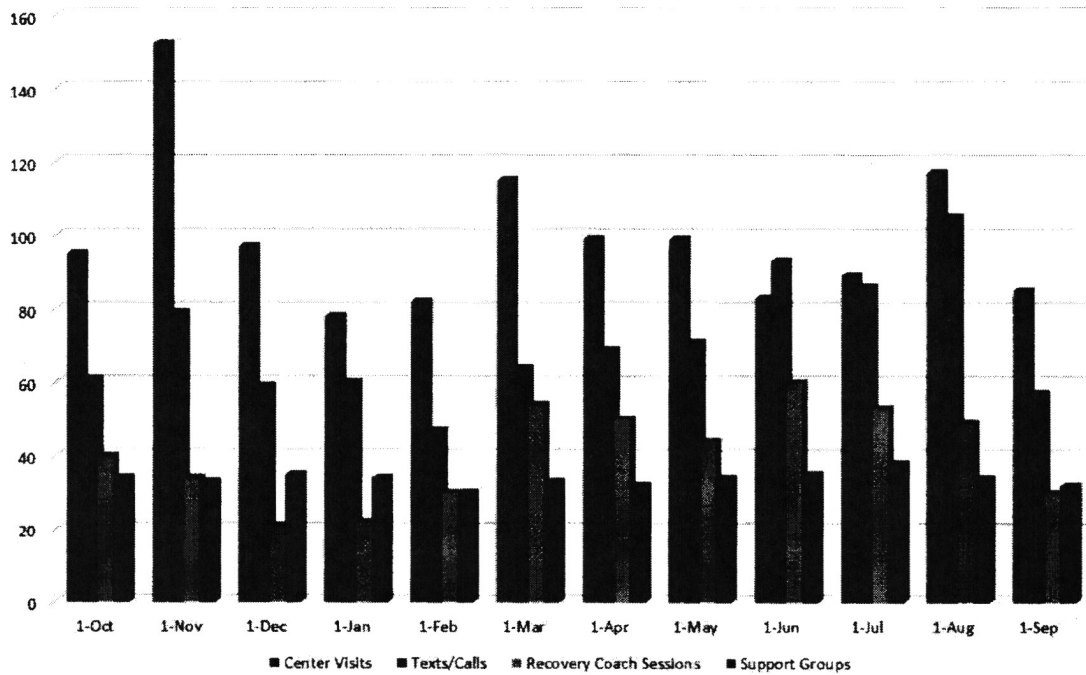

Executive Summary

Our Mission

Our mission is to strengthen families in the Valley and Adams County community and to prevent child abuse through education and intervention. Ignite Idaho Family Resource Center is aware of the myriad issues that weaken families and contribute to adverse childhood experiences, and we aim to address these issues from multiple areas. Real-life challenges require a compassionate approach and multi-faceted problem-solving, and we aim to get creative as we walk alongside families in their struggles. Through creating stronger families, we create a healthier community and brighter future for all.

Our Goals

- To equip parents with stronger parenting, relational, and social-emotional skills through education
- To support and improve parent-child and other familial relationships through counseling
- To provide safety for families in abusive situations
- To connect families with others experiencing similar hardships, in order to build community
- To raise funds to empower abused and battered men and women
- To find opportunities for temporary housing and supports for children and families in dangerous situations

Programs and Services

At the present time, Ignite Idaho Family Resource Center offers weekly group sessions to address coparenting, parenting teens, and coping with grief. These group sessions also help struggling individuals find connection and community with others experiencing similar hardships. Additionally, we are constantly developing and adding support groups, thus boosting the sense of community within families. We also offer parenting classes, and are working to provide additional parenting and training classes in the future. As we meet families, we often find that they are struggling in multiple areas and need additional resources; we work with many other organizations in our community and outside of our community to connect families with the resources and support they need.

In the future, we would like to expand our own resource offerings to short-term housing options for families in crisis and additional classes and groups.

Needs Analysis

There are 11,746 people in Valley County and 4,379 in Adams County. Of Valley County households, 18.3% have children under the age of 18 residing within them. Of Adams County households, 17.3% have children under the age of 18 residing within them. There are a total of 4 public school districts in Adams and Valley County, one private school, and no charter school options. In Valley County, 8.7% % of households are living in poverty. In Adams County, 13.7% of households are living in poverty. As numerous studies have proven, poverty itself is an adverse childhood experience and puts children at greatest risk for experiencing adverse childhood experience (ACEs).¹

In addition, Valley and Adams Counties are part of the West Central Mountains region of Idaho. There are challenges unique to the West Central Mountains in its isolated nature. The nearest major airport is 112 miles away and the nearest children's hospital is 109 miles away. Similarly, the nearest shelters (both homeless shelters and specifically women's shelters) are over 100 miles away in the Boise, Idaho area. The nearest Walmart is 102 miles away. There are only two major highways that lead to and from the area, with often-treacherous road conditions; in November and December 2021, Highway 55 was closed for two weeks, which limited travel options to one highway for residents of the area. Families must travel to get access to basic support and even shopping, and this isolation can add unique hardship to those in need of support and services. With global changes in COVID, our local area has seen an increase in struggles in family mental health and domestic violence.

In the past year, we have offered services to several dozen families, including simply connecting struggling families with other resources. In 2021, over 30 families attended our Love and Logic parenting courses that we provided in collaboration with Jaime's Place Pregnancy Resource Center. Many have expressed a need and desire for additional education in parenting, relationships, and additional social-emotional development. With constant changes in local policy, including mask mandates from both the government and public schools, we have seen an uptick in families in crisis in our schools, in our churches, and in other parts of our communities. The national housing crisis is amplified in our small, insular resort community and the lack of housing has compounded family crises.

In a small community like the Valley-Adams County area, word-of-mouth remains one of the most effective methods of marketing. Additionally, social media is a powerful presence. As we work to make connections within our community and educate community members about the services Ignite Family Resource Center wishes to provide local families with, it is important that we take a multi-faceted approach.

We want to maintain a social media presence, primarily on Facebook, as a means of making families and other community members aware of our existence. Additionally, we rely heavily on the use of flyers and business cards in order to provide in-person advertising in important places. Flyers help teachers and administrators, as well as clergy members and doctors, connect the people they serve with resources aimed at helping them with specific parenting and family related issues.

Finances

We received approval of our 501(c)3 organization in March of 2022. Currently, we are operating exclusively on donations of time and supplies from those involved with our organization. As soon as we are able to accept tax-deductible donations, we have several who have pledged us money. With continued growth, we plan to work to diversify our income streams as much as possible, from earned income for services (from those who are able to pay for services), nonprofit donations, fundraising events, and grant funding. We have a plan to steward our resources well in order to maximize our efficacy and help as many families as possible. Our current expenses are mostly limited to office supplies and rental of office and communal meeting spaces; as we expand into creating a safe house for families fleeing domestic violence situations and offering more expansive programming office, our budget needs will grow.

Our proposed budget information is available upon request.

Contingencies

As a non-profit organization with the sole intent of helping hurting families, Ignite Idaho Family Resource Center is prepared to expect the unexpected. Three major potential problems Ignite Idaho could face include: funding problems, quarantine and COVID-related operational changes, and a higher-than-anticipated amount of families in need of services.

Funding for any small, non-profit organization in a rural community is difficult to obtain. One of the main ways we aim to alleviate our funding problems is through use of a grant writer to apply for grants on our behalf. Additionally, we plan to network within our community to host several fundraising opportunities throughout the calendar year, including restaurant benefit nights and auctions. As we continue to market ourselves and become well-known in the community, we feel confident that financial support will continue to grow from community members who are interested in philanthropy and able to provide necessary support. The growth

of our programs and services will depend on what we can feasibly, sustainably continue to provide to our community.

The current coronavirus pandemic has been a reality for two years now. As such, we are well-versed in providing services to those who are quarantined and/or ill. Our two primary organization members, an LPC and a LMFT, have been able to provide telehealth options and meet with clientele over Zoom and other video call formats. While obtaining access to computers and WiFi remains difficult for families struggling with poverty, we have found that most families have access to a smartphone and LTE data plans. Additionally, families can park beside the public library and use the WiFi from the building, if needed. We are also able to host in-person meetings that include social distancing and ample sanitization. It is so important to continue providing services to those who may feel an additional burden of isolation in this uncertain time, and Ignite Idaho plans to continue to implement creative and safe means of continuing to provide services.

As Ignite Idaho grows, we may find an overwhelming amount of families in our area in need of services. We are hopeful that we will be able to grow our funding and staffing to accommodate this growth, but if we struggle to do so, we plan to continue to maintain strong relationships with other organizations in and out of our community. Through developing a strong network of professionals in various industries as well as with other nonprofits and agencies, we will be able to provide referrals if we ourselves are unable to provide services.

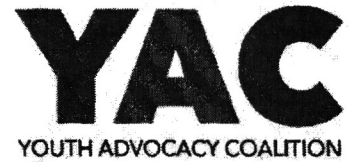

My name is Courtney Hill, PA and I am the sole Physician Assistant provider for McCall Mobile Medicine. I started my business with the goal of providing affordable telemedicine visits and care for Behavioral Health and Substance Use Disorders to the residents of Valley County. I have been a volunteer for the Valley County Opioid Response Project (VCORP) and serve as the treatment chair on the steering committee. It is through my work with VCORP that the need for easily accessible and immediate connection to a provider came to my attention and the services provided through McCall Mobile Medicine utilize my skills and experience to address specific needs and gaps in our system of care in Valley County.

Although I am a long standing member and volunteer with VCORP, I am not a sub-grantee of either of the two HRSA grants that VCORP is currently funding programs with. The start-up and maintenance costs of the services that I offer and provide, (such as my medical malpractice insurance, Electronic Medical Records, Electronic Prescribing Services for mental health and Medication Assisted Treatment, website, etc.) have all been being paid out of my own pocket. I have been charging only \$40 per session if the client has the means.

The psychiatric evaluations, assessments, treatment plans, medication management and MAT services that I provide all align with the Treatment services allowed through the Opioid Settlement Funds. (*See Attached).

I am respectfully requesting \$10,000 to offset the costs of maintaining these services to Valley County Residents so that I can remain on-call and available to provide immediate connection to behavioral health and MAT services this year. This would enable me to provide services at no cost to Valley County

residents and work on becoming an insurance provider for those who have third party payer funding available.

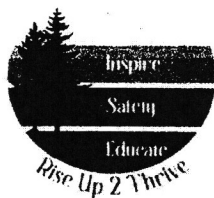

As Executive Director, I am requesting \$10,000 in financial assistance for Rise Up 2 Thrive (RU2T) through the Valley County Opioid Settlement funds under Abatement Strategy Category 6 "Treatment of trauma for individuals with OUD (e.g., violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, or adverse childhood experiences) and family members (e.g., surviving family members after an overdose or overdose fatality), and training of health care personnel to identify and address such trauma."

Domestic violence and substance use are intertwined. According to SAMSHA, physical violence is 11 times more likely to occur among intimate partner violence (IPV) batterers and victims on days of heavy substance use. Further, in 40% to 60% of IPV incidents, substance abuse was involved. Locally, the situation appears to be worse. In ~ 90% of local cases substance use appears to be involved during an escalation of violence. Additionally, Idaho's Risk Assessment names drug/opioid/alcohol abuse as a contributing factor to lethality in domestic violence. Already, in the first four months since launching RU2T has worked with 19 individuals that disclosed that there were drugs/opioids or alcohol present during an assault.

Besides heavy drug and alcohol use increasing a person's risk for perpetrating IPV, perpetrators may coerce their victims into using substances. Further, many victims/survivors of domestic violence report using alcohol or other drugs to help them lessen the pain of abuse, and IPV victims are at an increased risk of developing a drug or alcohol addiction. The National Center on Domestic Violence, Trauma & Mental Health reports that of women receiving addiction treatment, 67% reported experiencing physical IPV in the past six months; of women who use injectable drugs, 31% experienced physical and sexual IPV in the past year; and of women getting methadone treatment, 90% experienced IPV in their lifetime.

RU2T provides the highest quality crisis intervention, safety planning, problem solving, hospital support, court accompaniment, referrals (including to substance use treatment and recovery services), and a plethora of other services for victims of domestic violence in Valley County. We strive to provide an environment that is safe, available, convenient and secure for our victims. The requested funds would support these services. We ask that funds be allocated to RU2T our clients recover from substance-use related IPV and their own and the effects of their partners substance use. We have requested a letter of support from VCORP.

As Executive Director, I am requesting \$10,000 in financial assistance for Rise Up 2 Thrive (RU2T) through the Valley County Opioid Settlement funds under Abatement Strategy Category 6 "Treatment of trauma for individuals with OUD (e.g., violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, or adverse childhood experiences) and family members (e.g., surviving family members after an overdose or overdose fatality), and training of health care personnel to identify and address such trauma."

Domestic violence and substance use are intertwined. According to SAMSHA, physical violence is 11 times more likely to occur among intimate partner violence (IPV) batterers and victims on days of heavy substance use. Further, in 40% to 60% of IPV incidents, substance abuse was involved. Locally, the situation appears to be worse. In ~ 90% of local cases substance use appears to be involved during an escalation of violence. Additionally, Idaho's Risk Assessment names drug/opioid/alcohol abuse as a contributing factor to lethality in domestic violence. Already, in the first four months since launching RU2T has worked with 19 individuals that disclosed that there were drugs/opioids or alcohol present during an assault.

Besides heavy drug and alcohol use increasing a person's risk for perpetrating IPV, perpetrators may coerce their victims into using substances. Further, many victims/survivors of domestic violence report using alcohol or other drugs to help them lessen the pain of abuse, and IPV victims are at an increased risk of developing a drug or alcohol addiction. The National Center on Domestic Violence, Trauma & Mental Health reports that of women receiving addiction treatment, 67% reported experiencing physical IPV in the past six months; of women who use injectable drugs, 31% experienced physical and sexual IPV in the past year; and of women getting methadone treatment, 90% experienced IPV in their lifetime.

RU2T provides the highest quality crisis intervention, safety planning, problem solving, hospital support, court accompaniment, referrals (including to substance use treatment and recovery services), and a plethora of other services for victims of domestic violence in Valley County. We strive to provide an environment that is safe, available, convenient and secure for our victims. The requested funds would support these services. Please support our request to the Valley County Commissioners as we work to help our clients recover from IPV and their own and the effects of their partners substance use.
