

To: The Idaho Legislature and the Citizens of Idaho

Re: The Prosecution of Child Sexual Abuse

With this letter, we submit the annual report for Fiscal Year 2025 on the prosecution of child sexual abuse in Idaho. During FY2025, there were 889 reported incidents of child sexual abuse in Idaho. This is 126 reported incidents more than FY2024 and represents a 16.51% increase. Additionally, prosecutors in Idaho filed 1,232 child sexual abuse cases in FY2025, which was 36 fewer cases than FY2024 and represents a 2.83% decrease.

Taken together, these figures show that child sexual abuse remains a significant and ongoing concern throughout the state. The increase in reported incidents indicates that suspected abuse is being identified and brought to the attention of authorities more frequently, while the number of cases filed reflects a consistent prosecutorial response. Even with a slight year-over-year decline in filings, the overall volume of cases remains substantial, underscoring the enduring demands placed on law enforcement, prosecutors, and victim-support systems.

Addressing child sexual abuse requires sustained attention and deliberate action across multiple systems. Effective prevention and accountability depend not only on law enforcement and prosecutors, but also on informed families, vigilant communities, and institutions willing to recognize warning signs and respond appropriately. As reports increase, it is critical that Idaho continue to invest in the capacity of those charged with investigating and prosecuting these crimes. Ensuring that professionals have the training, tools, and support necessary to do this work is essential to protecting children and maintaining public trust.

REPORT SUMMARY

Incidents Reported
I.C. § 67-1405(1)

A total of 889 incidents of child sexual abuse were reported to the Department of Health and Welfare, Division of Family and Community Services in FY2025.

This represents a 16.51% increase with 126 more incidents reported over FY2025.

Cases Filed
I.C. § 67-1405(2)

A total of 1232 child sexual abuse cases were filed (1010 adult, 222 juvenile) in Idaho District and Juvenile Courts in FY2025.

This represents a 2.83% decrease with 36 fewer cases filed over FY2024.

Disposition
I.C. § 67-1405(3)

Child Sexual Abuse Conviction/Disposition Status:

- Prison – 157 adults
- Juvenile Corrections – 4 juveniles
- Probation – 22 adults, 69 juveniles
- Retained Jurisdiction – 14 adults
- Cases Pending – 552 adults, 103 juveniles
- Cases Dismissed – 263 adults, 46 juveniles
- Acquittals – 2 adults, 0 juveniles

Discharged Offenders
I.C. § 67-1405(4)

The Commission of Pardons and Parole granted parole to 326 inmates and discharged an additional 204 inmates who completed their sentence during FY2025 for committing child sexual abuse crimes.

DATA COLLECTION PROCESS

This report is prepared in accordance with I.C. § 67-1405 and is intended to reflect child sexual abuse incident data for FY2025 (July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025). The Office of the Attorney General compiles the data reported by the Department of Health and Welfare, County Prosecuting Attorneys, the Administrative Office of the Courts, and the Commission of Pardons and Parole relating to the following statutory sexual offenses involving children:

- Sexual Abuse of a Child Under the Age of Sixteen Years (I.C. § 18-1506)
- Sexual Exploitation of a Child (I.C. § 18-1507)
- Lewd Conduct with a Minor Child Under Sixteen (I.C. § 18-1508)
- Sexual Battery of a Minor Child Sixteen or Seventeen Years of Age (I.C. § 18-1508A)
- Enticing of Children Over the Internet (I.C. § 18-1509A)

I. REPORTED INCIDENTS

Idaho Code § 67-1405(1) provides:

The department of health and welfare, each city police department, each county sheriff, and the Idaho state police shall submit to the office of the attorney general a report of each child sexual abuse incident reported to each agency of state or local government. The report shall contain such information as specified by the attorney general. It shall be the duty of the attorney general to the greatest extent possible to use and develop the information required in this section on forms currently in use by each governmental entity, thus avoiding unnecessary paperwork.

Child sexual abuse incidents requiring involvement from the Department of Health and Welfare¹ for Fiscal Years 2013-2024, is as follows:

¹ The Attorney General recognizes that some incidents of child sexual abuse may be reported to local law enforcement entities but not reported to or investigated by the Dept. of Health and Welfare. There are no systems presently in place to identify such reports or to account for duplicate reporting of the same incident. Therefore, incident information included in this report is limited to those incidents of child sexual abuse reported to and investigated by the Department of Health and Welfare.

II. CASES FILED

Idaho Code § 67-1405(2) provides:

It shall be the duty of each county prosecuting attorney to submit to the office of the attorney general a report of each child sexual abuse case handled by the prosecuting attorney. The report required pursuant to this section shall be designed by the attorney general to minimize the paperwork impact on each county prosecutor.

a. ADULT OFFENDERS

In FY2025, Idaho's District Courts received 1010 cases among adult offenders related to statutory sexual offenses involving children. Chart A1 shows the most frequently filed charges.





Chart A2 shows the breakdown of adult case filings per Idaho judicial district.




Chart J2 shows the breakdown of juvenile case filings per Idaho judicial district.




III. DISPOSITION INFORMATION

Idaho Code § 67-1405(3) provides:

The administrative office of the courts shall submit to the office of the attorney general a report showing the disposition of each child sexual abuse case handled by each of the district courts throughout the state. This reporting requirement may be satisfied by submission of a copy of a judgment made and entered in each case.


a. ADULT OFFENDER DISPOSITIONS

IV. DISCHARGED OFFENDERS

Idaho Code § 67-1405(4) provides:

The commission on pardons and parole shall submit to the office of the attorney general a report showing the release or discharge of any individual convicted of a crime involving child sexual abuse. Such report shall be designed to minimize the paperwork impact upon the commission.

The Commission of Pardons and Parole reported 326 inmates were granted parole and an additional 204 were discharged for completing sentences of statutory sexual offenses involving children.


